Pursuant to Section 5.5 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) regulations at Title 18 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Southeast Alaska Power Agency (SEAPA) hereby gives notice and declares its intent to file an Application for a New License for the Swan Lake Hydroelectric Project (No. 2911). The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of 18 CFR § 5.5 and 16.6(b):

3. License expiration date:

The Commission issued a 50-year license to operate the Swan Falls Hydroelectric Project (Project). The license was issued on July 17, 1980, and expires on June 30, 2030.

4. Unequivocal statement of intent:

SEAPA hereby unequivocally declares its intent to file an Application for a New License for the Swan Lake Hydroelectric Project (FERC No. 2911). As set forth in the cover letter filed with this Notice of Intent, SEAPA also requests the Commission's approval to use the Traditional Licensing Process (TLP) for the relicensing of the Project.

5. Description of principal project works to be licensed:

The Project consists of Swan Lake Dam (a 174-foot-tall concrete arch dam), creating a 102,476 acre-feet active storage reservoir (from reservoir elevation of 271.5 feet to elevation 345.0 feet mean sea level). Water passes through a concrete power tower located on the right abutment upstream of the dam and passes through a 2,221-foot-long, 11-foot-diameter power tunnel to the powerhouse. The tunnel feeds an indoor-type powerhouse fitted with two 12,500 kilovolt ampere (kVA) Francis turbine generating units having an authorized installed capacity of 25 megawatts (MW). Power is transmitted from the powerhouse along non-primary transmission lines to Ketchikan, Wrangell, and Petersburg, Alaska via the Swan-to-Bailey transmission line and Swan-Tyee Intertie.

A description of all Project facilities and dimensions is available in the Preliminary Application Document (PAD).

6. Location of the Project:

The Project is located on Revillagigedo Island in the Swan Lake–Falls Creek drainage basin near the northern end of Carroll Inlet, in the Ketchikan Gateway Borough, approximately 22 air-miles northeast of Ketchikan, Alaska.

7. The authorized installed capacity of the Project:

The Project has a total authorized capacity of 25 MW.
